After reading the proposed burn pit "registry", it appears to be slanted toward proving the health of military personnel was *not* affected by the burn pits rather than locating all who became ill due to exposure.

Also, I see no where to indicate the service member is *dead*. My son died from Hodgkins Lymphoma on 9/7/9 after running patrols for a year at Camp Victory, Baghdad, Iraq. He was also diagnosed with meningitis and bacterium avium, all of which have been linked to burn pit and airborne exposure in Iraq.

It is my understanding that the purpose of the registry is to identify people who have become ill after exposure to the burn pits, not to prove that the burnpits did not cause the illness. This is not a registry but instead a questionnaire to place blame for illness elsewhere.

Lets do what the bill intended!!!!
